All visitors will be met at Reception Reef in the Children's Hospital.

Considerations for a Successful Visit

Please be prepared to interact with all ages of children in the hospital during your visit. The patients in Children's Hospital range in age anywhere from birth to 18 years of age with a variety of diagnoses including cancer, blood disorders, surgeries, respiratory problems and trauma. The average length of a hospital stay on the pediatric unit is 3-5 days.

Because of the rapid turnover rate and acuity level of the patients, we are unable to guarantee the size and age of the audience. A Child Life staff member will be supervising the entire event and can answer any questions that may arise.

We prefer to focus on the positive aspects of the child's stay in the hospital. Therefore, please refrain from asking patients and/or families about the child's diagnosis or reason for hospitalization.

Because the hospital serves a variety of cultures, please respect the diversity of religious beliefs that you may encounter on the unit. The hospital chaplain must approve and conduct all religious materials or visits.

Please do not wrap any gifts being brought into the Children's Hospital. Do not bring glass or small breakable items that could be ingested by small children. Because latex balloons are a choking hazard, only Mylar balloons can be brought in or distributed to pediatric patients. For infection control purposes, all donations must be new and unused.
