Intensive Care Unit ECU Health Chowan Hospital

Primary Population: Acute stroke management, aggressive and complex management of various medical and surgical complications

Patient Care

The population consists of patients requiring inpatient management of various medical and surgical conditions. This includes, but is not limited to:

- Acute stroke management (ischemic, hemorrhagic, SAH, etc.)
- Diabetic ketoacidosis (DKA)
- Pre and post-operative care of orthopedic, urological and general surgical patients
- Various infectious disease processes
- Various respiratory conditions
- Various cardiac conditions

Patients in this setting may require frequent assessments, interventions and collaborative evaluations to manage and improve the overall health of the patient. Continuity of care is facilitated in this unit through ICU transition for optimization of clinical outcomes.

Registered nurses provide care in conjunction with multi-disciplinary medical team. Assignments are based on the acuity of the patient condition, skill set of the scheduled nurses, and the resources available. There is no dedicated charge nurse on the unit; the house supervisor manages capacity management. BLS and ACLS are required upon hire; PALS is required within 6 months of hire.

Shift Options: Day, night, rotating day/night, rotating weekends

Primary Population: Management of any emergent, urgent, or non-urgent patient

Patient Care

The population consists of pediatrics and adults. This includes, but is not limited to:

- Acute stroke management (ischemic, hemorrhagic, SAH, etc.)
- Trauma/lacerations
- Seizure management (epilepsy, post-ictal and pseudo-seizures)
- Hypertensive emergencies
- Hyper/Hypoglycemia
- STEMI

Patients in this setting may require frequent assessments and collaborative evaluations to manage care status. Continuity of care is facilitated in this unit through admission, transfer, or consultation for optimization of clinical outcomes.

Registered nurses provide care in conjunction with the nursing assistant and providers.

- Peripheral lab draws
- Various intravenous drips (e.g. cardiac, insulin, heparin, and cardiac monitoring)
- NIHSS
- Collaboration with the multidisciplinary team

Medical/Surgical Unit ECU Health Chowan Hospital



Overview

Bed Count: 16-bed unit (intermediate and general)

Staffing Ratios: 1:6 RN-to-patient (general), 1:4 RN-to-patient (intermediate)

Shift Options: Day, Night

Scheduling: Self-scheduling

Primary Population: Provide continuous care to medical patients admitted with various diagnosis including, but not limited to sepsis, UTI, acute stroke management, DKA, pancreatitis, various cardiac and respiratory conditions and care of the pre and post-operative general surgical, gynecological and orthopedic patient population.

Outpatient Specialty Clinic ECU Health Chowan Hospital

Shift Options: Day, Monday-Friday
Scheduling: Manager scheduling
Primary Population: Adult and pediatric outpatient specialty care

Patient Care

The population consists adult and pediatric outpatient specialties. This includes, but is not limited to:

- Cardiology (adult and pediatric)
- EMG
- Hematology/medical oncology and chemotherapy (adult only)

- Infusion therapy
- Nephrology (adult)
- Sleep medicine (adult)
- Wound healing

Patients seen in this multi-specialty outpatient setting will receive high quality, evidence-based, coordinated care aimed at providing access to screenings, prevention, early detection and intervention of acute and chronic disease processes. Continuity of care is facilitated in this unit through communication and collaboration with all members of the patient's healthcare team to help ensure optimization of clinical outcomes.

Registered nurses provide care in conjunction with the nursing assistant and medical team. Assignments are based on the patient's needs and the resources available. BLS, ACLS, and PALS is required.

- EKGs
- Chemotherapy administration
- Exercise and pharmacological stress testing
- Comprehensive wound care (compression therapy and wound vacs)
- IV start skills
- Peripheral and central line management, including phlebotomy
- Infusion therapy (e.g. antimicrobial therapy, blood transfusions, bone strengtheners, IV hydration, monoclonal antibodies, rabies vaccines)
- Assisting with procedures (e.g. simple biopsies, wound debridement, bone marrow biopsies)

Primary Population: Pediatric patients (1 year or older) and adult surgical patients

Post Anesthesia Care Unit ECU Health Chowan Hospital

Staffing Ratios: Two competent nursing team members, one of whom is an RN competent in Phase 1 recovery, are in the same room or unit where the patient is receiving care. Staffing ratios are adjusted based on patient acuity and age. **Shift Options:** Day

Scheduling: Assistant Nurse Manager completes schedule

Primary Population: Pediatric patients (1 year or older) and adult surgical patients

Patient Care

The Ambulatory Surgery Unit provides quality care to patients in our service area who are in need of surgical and pain management procedures. Specific services provided include:

- Pre-operative care if surgery patients for all surgery services
- Post-operative care of surgery patients for all surgery services
- Outpatient lithotripsy (contracted services)
- Pain management procedures
- Surgical services include general surgery, orthopedic surgery, urologic surgery, and OB/GYN surgery

Every patient is assessed and a complete medical, surgical, and medication history is obtained and reviewed. Care for the patient if individualized according to the needs made known by these or other measures.

Family Birth Center ECU Health Chowan Hospital

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Overview

Bed Count: 5 LDRPs, 1 postpartum room, 2-bed triage
Staffing Ratios: 3 RNs scheduled on each shift. Dependent upon unit census in accordance with AWHONN Perinatal Unit Staffing Guidelines. 2 RNs must be in the building at all times.
Shift Options: Day, night, rotating day/night, rotating weekends
Scheduling: Self-scheduling
Primary Population: Maternal and newborn patients
Leadership: Allison Eure, Nurse Manager, Allison.Eure@ecuhealth.org

Patient Care

The population consists of maternal patients throughout various stages from antepartum, labor, delivery, and postpartum as well as newborns. The unit recoveries patients after undergoing a cesarean section as well as some other general surgery patients. We offer quality prenatal care and childbirth services to women throughout the surrounding counties we serve. The unit provides care to patients 35 weeks gestation or greater. Those under 35 weeks are stabilized and transferred to a higher level of care. The unit also provides care to GYN surgery patients as needed.

Patients in this setting require ongoing assessments for maternal/fetal status changes. The team must be able to recognize changes and respond appropriately to emergency situations in collaboration with the provider.

Registered nurses provide care in conjunction with the OB providers. Assignments are based upon unit census in accordance with AWHONN Perinatal Unit Staffing Guidelines. BLS is required upon hire. ACLS and NRP are required within 6 months of hire.

- IV start skills
- Peripheral lab draws and newborn heel sticks
- Various intravenous drips/titrations (e.g. Pitocin, Magnesium Sulfate)
- Cervical exams
- Fetal monitoring interpretation
